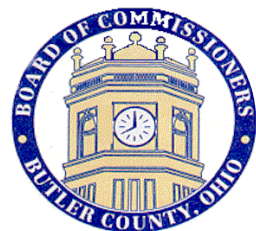

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

December is a time of reflection. Looking back on 2018, the year has definitely been marked by growth, challenge, and transition. We know that as we embark on 2019 and the next fifty years, there have been many reasons to rejoice. However, there is still much work to do. We hope that our friends, old and new, will continue this journey for fair housing, equity, and justice with us.

- In April, we celebrated the Fair Housing Act and HOME's 50th Anniversary where we honored five decades of our champions and engaged our friends about our path forward (see back cover for more).
- We continued our advocacy promise to the residents of Hamilton, Butler, Clermont, and Warren Counties by assisting with claims of illegal discrimination and other housing issues. We used a broad range of enforcement tools to help our clients obtain justice.
- In November, HOME partnered with the Community Building Institute at Xavier University to convene

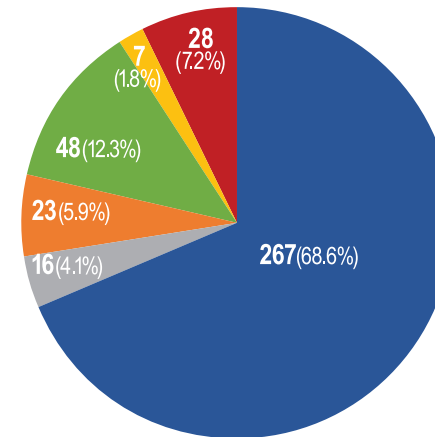
130 community partners about civil rights for people with disabilities; we imagined how to make universal accessibility and affordable housing a reality.

- HOME offered fair housing training and advice for local housing providers and government officials. We also joined the Cincinnati Area Board of Realtors in commemorating 50 years of fair housing and a joint pledge for the future.
- HOME continued to forge and strengthen partnerships; including working with the Cincinnati Project, Legal Aid, and the University of Cincinnati to release a study spotlighting the eviction crisis in our region. Much of the data found in this study is in use by local policymakers.

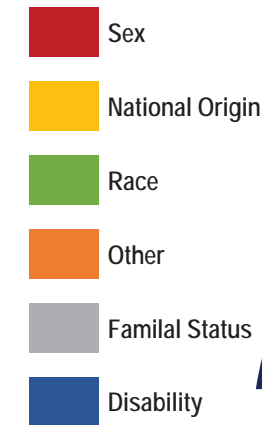

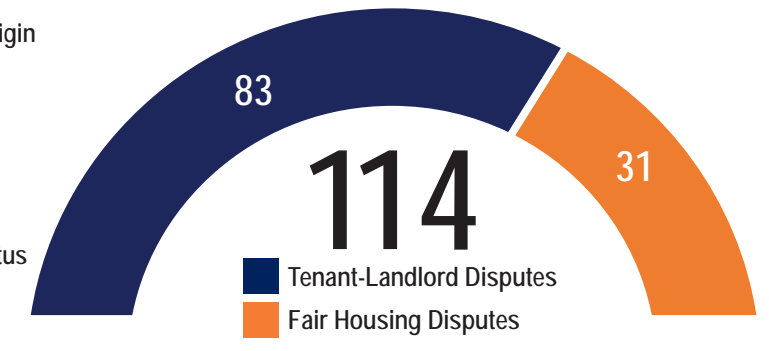
Fair Housing Calls Received by Protected Class



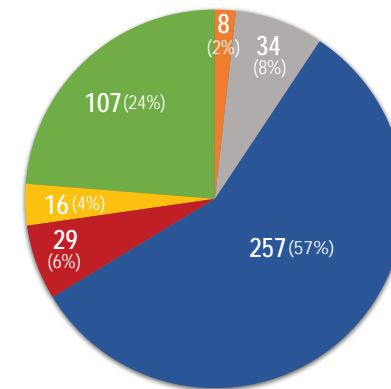
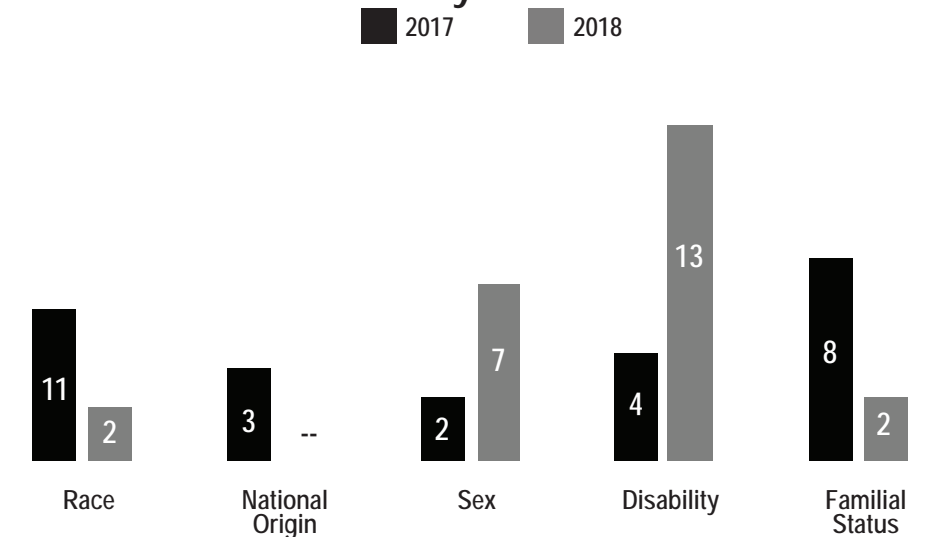
2018 Calls Received

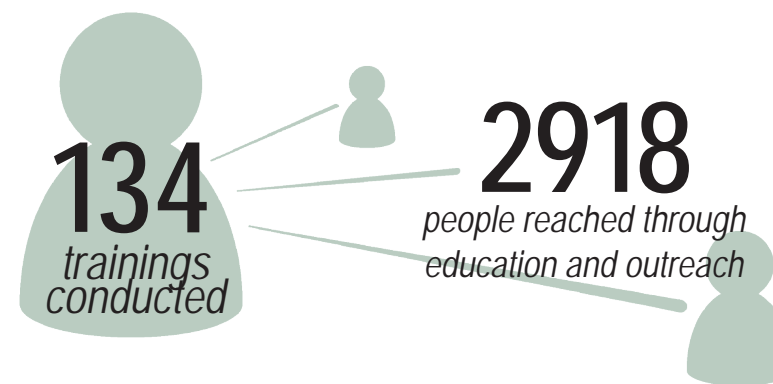
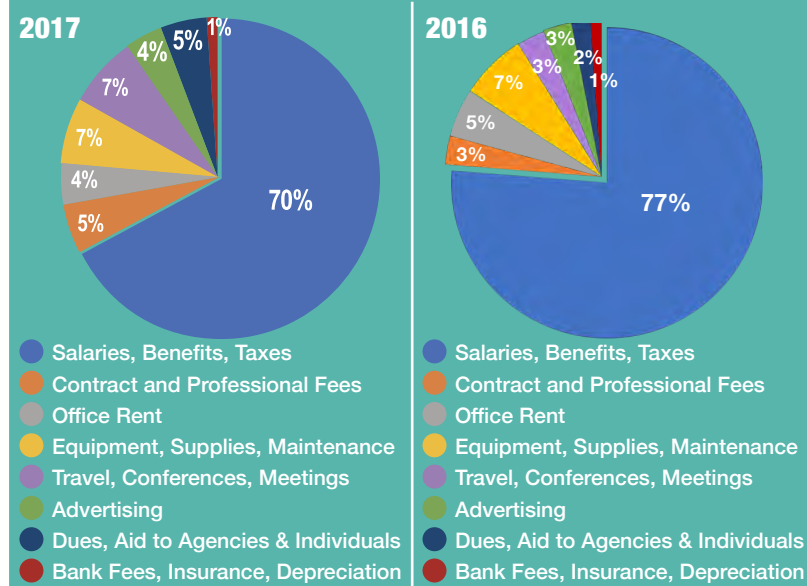
